Reflections on Spring Showers by Connie Kratzke

Here I sit, watching the Seinfeld where George saves a whale from Kramer's golf ball while pretending to be a marine biologist. I should be at work on this cloudy, spring day; but some kind of bug has wiped me out. After an extended weekend of abundant rest, I'm hoping my energy will return tomorrow. My original mission was to poke around the yard on my days off and I didn't get that done. While windy and wet, it was the perfect catalyst for growth. Luckily, next weekend is looking lovelier than the last.

The first blooms of spring are delightful to my eyes. Crocuses are still brightening up our surroundings and more spring bulbs are right behind them. After a peek out the window to confirm my theory, I can say that my Pulmonarias are loaded with buds. Vincas and Epimediums should be chiming in anytime now. Anemones and Aquilegias, Brunneras and Bergenias will all participate in the matinee. I enjoy the first two in my gardens and the latter two at work. Bleeding Hearts, Peonies, Forsythias and Lilacs will visit like beloved relatives; delivering cheer. Pastel carpets of low-growing Phlox will meander through neighborhoods near you. May Apples and Lady Slippers are favorites in my collection, whose appearance really seals the spring deal for me. It won't be too long now. The landscape is waking up!

Some spring bloomers are ephemeral, leaving obvious voids during their summer siestas. Others just lose their sheen after they bloom, like Aquilegias. Leaf Miners do their thing and so it goes. Good of Hostas make excellent companions for these plants. So do compact Eupatoriums and other late risers. "To everything there is a season." Early Irises mix well with reblooming Daylilies for extended displays in narrow borders. Iberises, Dianthus, Nepetas and Alliums can be combined for continuous flowering from last frost until the first, crisp night.

Mixing early bloomers into designs is good for mental health. While their seasons are short, gardens can be their timeshares. Our growing season is short, so why not embrace all of it? As fulfillment manager, I see lots of summer staples go out the door and fewer spring icons. As the person who orders perennial stock, I feel the need to promote the Robins of the bunch. They may be more challenging to incorporate, but they are supplements of joy when we need them most. Vitamin D can't do what they do. I can't wait to get back to the colorful greenhouses tomorrow and see what's changed during the three days I've been away.
